SS: How did you first become aware of the Sealyham Terrier?

BW: My knowledge goes back to my mother's oldest sister. She had Sealyhams back in Scotland. I can recall a photo taken in the 1920s whereby my aunt was outside with her three Sealyhams. The dogs were all doing the "Sealy Sit".

SS: When did you get your first Sealyham?

BW: I got my first Sealyham from Maurice and Florence Yunik. That was back in the late 1960s or early 1970s. It was a male we called Morgan.

SS: Tell us a bit about your years breeding.

BW: After Morgan, I got my dogs mostly from England from Biddy Horn's Topstage line. In those days, before the internet, we would send letters and pictures back and forth.

I would go to England and pick the dog up.

I showed my dogs mostly in Canada.

On the odd occasion I would send a dog out with a handler.

I loved showing my own dogs!

a variant of etching that produces areas of tone rather than lines.

Experimentation with somewhat different techniques reached a peak after 1750. As the artists were very secretive the history of the emergence of the standard technique remains unclear.

After a period of several decades in the central 19th century when the technique was little used, and definitely superseded for commercial uses, it was revived at the end of the century in France by Eduard Manet, Degas, Pissarro and other artists.


This aquatint was done in 1948 by renowned terrier judge Joseph P. Sims.

When not at work clearing a farm of unwanted rodents, they can be found at county fairs promoting the Sealyham Terrier.



Charming Story from Wales

Friend of the Sealyham terrier, Janette Griffiths, sent us this wonderful little story about the Corgi. We love our short legged breeds. It was such a delightful read I couldn't not include it.

I heard this story and thought it was worth sharing because it is utterly charming.... Nothing to do with the current world but from the 19th century: - it is a tale of livestock being driven from Wales to Smithfield market:

In certain places along the route the livestock was rested in large paddocks and even today the improved soil fertility still shows, especially from the air. The drovers stayed well away from the turpike roads to avoid paying the toll, and several of these roads with their wide grass verges can be seen today to the east of Cirencester and around Fairford and Lechlade. As London's population expanded so the drovers became important figures who not only had to be hardy but trustworthy since they carried large sums of money back to the farmers. My brother, who keeps sheep on Black Mountains in South Wales and uses Welsh Corgi dogs, told me the drovers used Corgis to assist in driving the cattle. They were quick, nimble and being quite small, didn't eat too much. On the return journey when passing through Oxfordshire and approaching the Cotswolds, the dogs would take off and head for home. When small groups of unattended dogs were seen passing through the farms and villages, Cotswold people knew the drovers were only a day or so behind them. When the dogs arrived home the families expected their men folk to be home, with their pay, in




about three or four days" time.




